

Being a Student in the CT and MR Certificate Programs

The CT and MR certificate programs are demanding and involve a substantial commitment of time each week plus homework. Students must maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA in all CT or MR courses to remain in the program; be adequately prepared to meet the challenge; and establish priorities prior to the start of classes.

Clinical Attendance

Students must complete 240 hours of clinical education for CT or MR. The requirement of clinical education is considered necessary to complete the repetitions needed for eligibility to challenge the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists Post-Primary Certification Examinations in CT and/or MR.

Clinical Placement

In the clinical setting, students will have an opportunity to apply theory to practice under supervision. Clinical placements can be in locations throughout the state and only at those clinical facilities with whom Yavapai College's CT and MR certificate programs have clinical-affiliation agreements. Clinical assignments are scheduled during the weekday between 5 a.m. and 7 p.m. The clinical instructor will determine the starting time of a student's shift.
