# A Note from the Associate Dean of Nursing

Welcome nursing students to the FALL 2024 semester. Currently, there are approximately 230 students enrolled in the nursing program at the Prescott and Verde Valley locations, including a new cohort of 62 first-semester students! This is a 24% increase from previous semesters, thanks to a Nursing Education Investment grant (HB2691).

Our RN-BSN program is well underway with 96 students enrolled in the program. From the Spring 24 cohort, we are expecting 13 graduates in December from this program. We were approved as candidates for initial accreditation in November 2023. We have a self-study report due January 2025 and a site visit is scheduled for March 2025 to become fully accredited. Official approval will be determined by Fall 2025. Once approved, our accreditation status is backdated to the time of our eligibility/candidacy was accepted which was November 16, 2023. As a result, any graduate from the RN-BSN program will have graduated from an accredited program.

This RN-BSN is post-licensure, meaning applicants must possess an unencumbered RN license to apply. YC graduates will be credited with 68.5 credits for their AAS degree. The nursing major courses consist of 30.5 credits plus 3 credits of statistics, leaving an additional 18 credits of electives to be completed for a total of 120 credits for a BSN degree. All YC nursing graduates will be automatically accepted into the program pending licensure verification.

We have opened LPN-RN advance placement applications for admission to the third semester. We had two students enrolled in the Spring and one student enrolled in the Fall.

The nursing program collaborated with Allied Health to offer an LPN step-out option for nursing students completing year one of the program. The step-out option will begin Spring 2025. This course allows students to seek their LPN license and enter the workforce to earn a more livable wage.



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Yavapai College (YC) Nursing graduates continue to be successful on the NCLEX-RN Licensure with a first-time pass rate of 94% year-to-date for 2024\*. These rates remain comparable to the 95% pass rate for the state of Arizona and the 92% pass rate nationally.

Our program completion rate for 2023-2024 was 77.6%.

As of January 2024, Yavapai College is ranked 11<sup>th</sup> out of 33 nursing schools across Arizona<sup>\*\*</sup>, according <u>Registered Nursing.org</u>. This ranking is up from 12<sup>th</sup> in 2023 and based on current and historical NCLEX pass rates.

Currently, according to the Arizona Board of Nursing, there are 112,341 RN's practicing in Arizona (www.azbn.gov). An increased demand for RNs in Arizona's future estimates 28,000 more needed by 2025\* (AZBN Newsletter, Nov 2022). Job Placement Rates for YC nursing graduates in 2024\* year-to-date is 63.8% with a 72% response rate.

Student assistance is always required to ensure we have the most accurate data. Be sure to look for postgraduate surveys and respond promptly.

The <u>Nursing Program Student Handbook</u> for 2024-2025 is available for students to review on the yc.edu/nursing. The handbook has extensive updates including new policies. Please be sure to read the handbook. Students are responsible each semester for knowing and following the contents of the most current Nursing Program Student Handbook and reviewing all YC e-NEWSFLASH communications or emails from <u>nursing@yc.edu</u> for important program announcements and policy updates.

Students can now register for nursing classes as soon as registration opens. This will enable students to self-schedule their courses and select their clinical placements. There are several disclaimers to this process:

- 1. Students who start in the evening cohort will always have first priority to register for the evening courses/clinical. Students who want to move from evening to day or days to evening must schedule an appointment with the Nursing Director to ensure availability.
- 2. Students must attend class/clinical on the campus they were accepted to. For example, a student living in Prescott Valley, who accepted program placement on the Verde campus, must attend clinicals in Verde.
- 3. Please pay attention to which course/campus you are registering for. Several students registered for classes on the incorrect campus.

Lastly, the nursing pinning ceremony will be on Friday December 13, 2024 @ 1pm. For Spring 2025, due to room/scheduling conflicts, the Nursing Pinning Ceremony will be on Thursday, May 1<sup>st</sup> at 5 pm.

Welcome back! I am excited to be seeing you all soon. Many things have changed this semester for clinical rotations. Both NAH and Dignity Health want ALL Clinical Requirements completed 1-month before the start date of your clinical rotation. This means having BOTH your Castle Branch AND your My Clinical Exchange updated through the end of the rotation. If you do not meet this deadline, you will not be able to get your badge and computer sign-on. Also, for students in Prescott, you will receive some email requests from Common Spirit. Common Spirit is the parent company of Dignity Health (YRMC). It is

important for you to respond and follow through with these emails. I will be stopping into one of your theory classes in September to give you additional information about these changes. Let's make it a great Fall Semester!

# **Clinical Updates:**

Health requirements are to be current throughout the entire semester. Students must meet all clinical compliance requirements by established due dates to be eligible to proceed into the clinical setting. Students who do not comply risk being administratively withdrawn from the clinical setting by the Nursing Director.

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There are **two clinical tracking systems** used in the nursing program. CastleBranch is a clinical tracking system that is used by the YC Nursing Program to ensure students are up to date on their clinical requirements. CastleBranch is first implemented upon admission to the program for students to purchase their background checks, drug screens, and the clinical health requirement checklist and must be maintained throughout the course of the nursing program.

My Clinical Exchange is used by the clinical agencies for 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4th-semester clinical requirements. Students must complete the required hospital onboarding modules in MyCE before orientation at the clinical site. Both sites must be maintained while in the nursing program.


#### Jennifer Brandt (Prescott Campus):

community. This will be her 2nd semester as SNA secretary.


#### Eric Ross – Treasurer:
