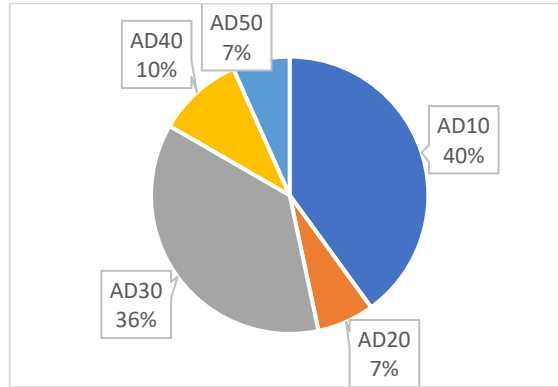


## YAVAPAI COLLEGE ASSESSMENT REPORTS AY 23-24

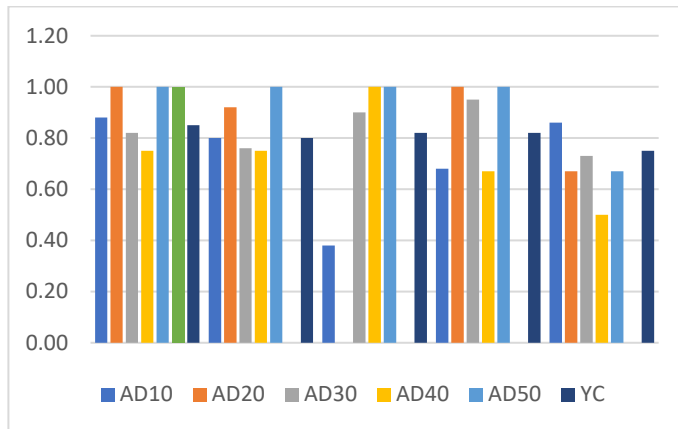

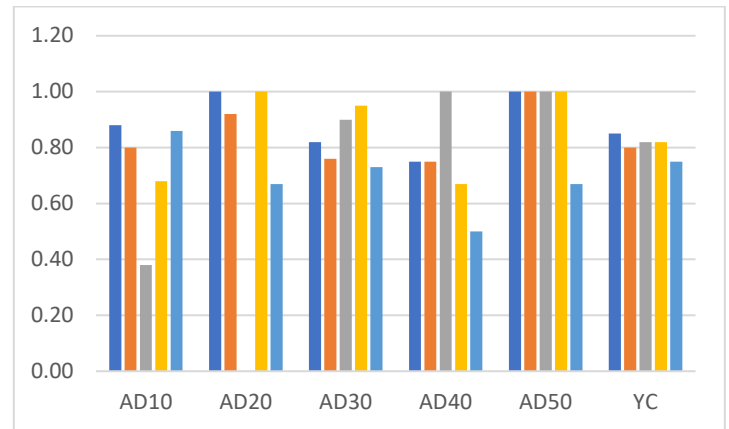

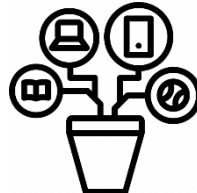

There are a number of reasons why a program would not complete an annual assessment report or postpone it altogether:

### AD10 (Morgan)

- **Film & Media Arts** (Excused) did not report student learning outcomes data due to the previous assessment cycle which required programs to report on PLOs in the first two years of the assessment plan cycle. Some programs did not plan to report on outcomes assessment in the third year.
- **Culinary Arts** (Excused) did not report student learning outcomes data due to the previous assessment cycle which required programs to report on PLOs in the first two years of the assessment plan cycle. Some programs did not plan to report on outcomes assessment in the third year.
- **Fire Science** (Postponed) will be making changes to the section-level curriculum in order to equalize student learning across the courses.
- **Brewing** (Postponed) is a new program that is continuing to grow and evolve. The associate dean, along with the Associate Vice President, determined that the program's assessment processes needed to be postponed.

### AD20 (Mercado/Ebersole)

- **Paramedicine and EMS** (Postponed) experienced section and course-level changes as directed by their external accreditation. In addition, the program experienced a change in the director in the middle of the spring semester.
- **Nursing Assistant** (Excused) did not report student learning outcomes data due to the previous assessment cycle which required programs to report on PLOs in the first two years of the assessment plan cycle. Some programs did not plan to report on outcomes assessment in the third year.
- **Rad Tech** (Excused) did not report student learning outcomes data due to the previous assessment cycle which required programs to report on PLOs in the first two years of the assessment plan cycle. Some programs did not plan to report on outcomes assessment in the third year.

### AD30 (Fisher)

- **Accounting** (Postponed) experienced a change in lead faculty and determined that the needed outcomes data was in a third party system that which the new lead faculty did not have access.

### AD50 (Baker)

- **Computer Systems & Applications** (Postponed) was repeatedly asked to submit report, but lead faculty never submitted.
- **Networking & Cybersecurity** (Excused) did not report student learning outcomes data due to the previous assessment cycle which required programs to report on PLOs in the first two years of the assessment plan cycle. Some programs did not plan to report on outcomes assessment in the third year.
