

Work products served as representative samples of Diversity Awareness and were rated using a modified VALUE rubric: 1 = Limited/No Proficiency (1^{st-year} college); 2 = Developing Proficiency (2^{nd-year} college); 3 = Proficiency (completing gen ed-level); 4 = Advanced Proficiency (completing BA/BS level)


